References



References are very important to evidence and validate the arguments presented in a written work.

All the sources of information used to create your paper, whether printed or electronic books, articles, interviews, among others, should be mentioned within the text to give credit to other authors' contributions.

Format:

- These should be **double spaced**, at the end of your paper, on a new page.
- On the top of the page, write and center the word "References" in **bold**.
- References are ordered alphabetically by author.
- The second line, and all subsequent lines, of each reference should have a hanging indent of 0.5 inches.

Basic Reference Format With Examples

Electronic Book

Surname(s), I. I. (Year of Publication). *Title*. Publisher. DOI or URL

Rhodes, M. (2019). *How to present to absolutely anyone: Confident public speaking and presenting in every situation*. John Wiley & Sons.

If it is a book or an article from an electronic magazine that comes from an academic database, the URL does not have to be included.

Chapter From an Edited Book

Surname(s), I. I. (Year of Publication). Title of the chapter. In I. I. Surname (Ed.), *Title of the book* (pp. xx-xx). Publisher. DOI or URL

Article in an Academic Journal

Surname(s), I. (Year of Publication). Article title. *Journal Title*, volume(no.), page numbers.
